

Gordon 'Umialiloalahanauokalakaua Kai will share his 45+ years of experience crafting na mea Hawai'i, including na mea kaua (things of war) and implements of daily use (such as the pahoa (dagger), ihe (spear), hina'i hinalea (fish trap) or poi pounder. Umi and his wife Janice are part of a small group of Native Hawaiian artists working to perpetuate the craft of making tools and weapons that were once essential to survival in these islands. Umi Kai will talk about the time-consuming process of transforming raw materials into functional, high quality works of art and show examples of his craftsmanship. (Adult Client Services, Circuit Court of the Second Circuit, Client Services Division, Judiciary Special Services Branch, Office of the Court Administrator, Maui Drug Court), Maui Memorial Medical Center, Lahaina Comprehensive Health Center, Lahaina Luna High School, Princess Nahienaena Elementary School, DBEDT Kihei, Kihei Public Library, Dept. of Labor and Industrial Relations, Dept. of Health, Dept. of Human Services, Dept. of Budget and Finance, and the Dept. of Land and Industrial Relations.




