**December 1842**

The United States recognizes the Kingdom of Hawai'i.

**December 1854**

Kamehameha III dies after 30 years on the throne (1824-54). He was the longest-reigning monarch of Hawai'i.

**December 1882**

The completion of the 'Iolani Palace is celebrated. It was erected at a cost of more than \$350,000.

**December 1941**

Japanese planes attack the U.S. Pacific Fleet at Pearl Harbor. More than 2,500 lives are lost. Martial law is declared.

**December 1952**

First regular television programming begins in Hawai'i on KGMB-TV.


