The Association of Honolulu Artists (AHA) was established in 1926, before the establishment and opening of the Honolulu Art Academy (now the Honolulu Museum of Art). With the exception of the Bishop Museum, there was no focal point for the arts. That year a small group of friends eager for cultural exchange gathered to discuss the arts and establish themselves as a membership organization devoted to the support and promotion of the growing arts community. This core group came to be known as "The Association of Honolulu Artists". Eventually the name was changed from the Association of Honolulu Artists to the Association of Hawaii Artists in order to encompass all islands in the State of Hawaii. *The Aloha Show* is their biggest annual exhibit, juried by a prominent local artist.
