musical bow) with Mahi La Pierre, a Hawaiian educator and mixed-media artisan. The only indigenous stringed instrument of Hawai'i, 'ūkēkē predate the ukulele and are for romance and courtship.

Mahi started researching the 'ūkēkē in 1998, made his first one in 2004, and is now on a mission to perpetuate this traditional practice for generations to come. He will bring a quiver of 'ūkēkē and share how these instruments are made and how to play them. Mahi will invite participants to learn and play *Mele Ūkēkē*, a traditional tune he learned from the great pahu and oli master, James Ka'upena Wong, Jr.

In early June, 27 elementary school teachers attended the ARTS FIRST Summer Institute organized by the Hawaii Arts Alliance, "Artful Thinking: Look, Infer, Wonder - Reading Images as Text." Presenters Jamie Simpson Steele and Abbey Day used artwork in the

HiSAM galleries to engage teachers in experiencing, developing and facilitating drama and visual arts strategies to deepen thinking about visual text. One teacher remarked "It was an eye-opening experience. The *Observe, Describe, Interpret* process allows for a higher level of thinking." The Hawaii Arts Alliance is the coordinator of this annual institute.

At the **Maui Arts & Cultural Center**'s Summer Institute "Integrating Portraits, Poetry and Printmaking," Kennedy Center presenters Melanie Rick and Glenis Redmond worked with 17 secondary school and 45 elementary school teachers in mid-June. In "Poetry Off the Page," Glenis showed how pre-writing activities can enhance student writing, while also "calling in the spirit of poetry." All teachers wrote and performed their own Praise Poems, a distinctive poem form used in many indigenous cultures. Melanie taught visual literacy by focusing on portraits in "Reading Portraits as Biographies: Observe. Infer. Inquire." Teachers used printmaking to create symbolic portraits of a historically important person.
